Described by the *New York Times* as "the classiest brass act going", they are the UK's most famous and long-established brass ensemble. London Brass have produced ground-breaking recordings on their own record label & with Warner Classics. The ensemble has appeared worldwide in concert and with educational events.

In very recent times, London Brass has toured throughout Europe and performed at various notable landmarks in the capital: Royal Albert Hall, Cadogan Hall, Barbican, Westminster Abbey, Westminster Cathedral, St Paul's Cathedral, The Old Whitehall & Banqueting House and 10 Downing Street, plus, for global televised occasions, such as the BBC Proms, Millennium Celebration Concert, Queens Jubilee and Papal Visit.
